- Prolonged jail stays that increase overcrowding and strain already limited staff and resources
- Restricted state hospital capacity that delays access for individuals with higher-acuity inpatient needs
- Heightened legal, compliance, and financial risk driven by prolonged system delays

- Court-ordered referral following competency evaluation

- Delivery of clinical care, competency education, and case coordination
- Weekly or more frequent engagement based on level of need
- Ongoing support across settings including jail and community
- Discharge planning and transition support through case resolution and community connection
